# KEWANEE COMMUNITY UNIT SCHOOL DISTRICT #229 BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING-MARCH 20, 2023

# CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL FOR REGULAR SCHEDULED BOARD MEETING

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Kewanee Community Unit School District No. 229 was held in the Kewanee High School Petersen Auditorium with President Johnson calling the Meeting to order at 6:00pm. Roll call showed the following Members present: Stabler, Dev, DeBord, Christiansen, Salisbury, Steffen, and Johnson. Superintendent Sullens was also present for the Closed Session.

# EXECUTIVE SESSION OF REGULAR SCHEDULED BOARD MEETING

At 6:01pm, Member Christiansen seconded a motion made by Member Dev to enter into Closed Session to consider (C)(1) the appointment, employment, compensation, discipline, performance or dismissal of specific employees of the District and (C) (2) to consider collective negotiating matters between the public body and its employees or their representatives, or deliberations concerning salary schedules for one or more classes of employees (C) (5) the purchase or lease of real property for the use of the public body (C) (8) Security Procedures (C) (9) Student Disciplinary Cases (C) (11) Litigation, \* 5ILCS 120/2 Open Meetings *The School Code of Illinois/2022*. Voice roll vote showed all present Members voting aye. The motion carried.

At 7:01 pm Member Steffen seconded a motion made by Member Stabler to adjourn the Closed Session meeting. Voice roll call was heard with all present Members voting aye. There were no nay votes. The motion carried.

President Johnson asked for a motion for a Consent Agenda and acceptance of Items V, VI & VII. Member DeBord seconded the motion made by Member Stabler to approve consent Items V, VI & VII. The roll showed Members Stabler, Dev, DeBord, Christiansen, Salisbury, Steffen, and Johnson all voting aye. There were no nay votes. The motion carried.

#### **COMMENTS FROM AUDIENCE**

Jon Looney, Black Hawk College Trustee, stated that his comments were his and not those of the Black Hawk Board of Trustees. He stated that Black Hawk College is currently searching for a President. The search committee will be holding Community Forums starting next week. The forums will be held in the auditorium at Black Hawk College-East Campus. Mr. Looney encouraged the Board and the public to attend and to provide feedback. Mr. Looney also thanked the Kewanee District for their partnership with Black Hawk College. The partnership has allowed many students the ability to earn dual credits. He stated that he would like the new President of Black Hawk to expand this partnership with Kewanee CUSD and other area districts in the future.

Jason Bates thanked the District and community for their support of his son Cooper throughout the speech season. Mr. Bates stated that he moved his family to Kewanee for the opportunities provided at Kewanee High School. He stated that the Arts programs and Instructors in the District are outstanding.

# **REPORT FROM ADMINISRATION**

#### Superintendent

#### State of Illinois FY24 Education Budget

Dr. Sullens stated that the Governor Pritzker has presented a budget proposal to the State legislators. He stated that the Governor recommended fully funding the Evidence Based Funding Model for FY24.

KHS Group Interp and Contest Play-Sectionals March 18<sup>th</sup> at Olympia High School

Dr. Sullens stated that Mrs. Baney would give the update on the KHS Group Interp and Contest Play.

# Discussion of Adding a JV Dance/Pom Squad

Dr. Sullens stated that Katie Rushing-Anderson the coach of the KHS Dance/Pom Squad contacted him about adding a JV Dance/Pom Squad for next year. This year, 34 students tried out for the squad. She would like to add a JV squad to work with students and improve their skills before they get to the Varsity squad. Students will still have the option of Fall, Winter, or both seasons. It is not believed that this would pull anyone from other sports. Member Christiansen stated that if it wouldn't affect other sports, she would be in support of adding a JV Squad.

# KHS Testing Schedule

Mrs. Baney stated that KHS students in grades 9-11 will be taking the PSAT and SAT on April 12<sup>th</sup>. The 12<sup>th</sup> grade students will be participating in a Career Day. The Career day is a Kiwanis Service Project held each year.

Mrs. Baney informed the Board that Group Interp placed second at the Olympia Sectional. They qualified to compete in the IHSA State Tournament on March 24 at Glenwood High School in Chatham, Illinois. The KHS Contest Play placed third at Sectionals and did not qualify for the State Tournament. Mrs. Baney informed the Board that Kenzie Carton and Kyle Joos were competing on March 25<sup>th</sup> for their SAE Proficiencies for FFA. By advancing, they are in the top 5 in the State for their areas.

# Mr. Atwell-KHS Athletic Director

#### Spring Sports Update

Mr. Atwell gave the Board an update on the KHS sports teams. He stated that Brady Clark was named TRAC Boys Basketball 1<sup>st</sup> Team. Mr. Atwell informed the Board that Will Taylor set the record for the most wins in a single wrestling season with 43. Spring sports numbers include 28 out for both the Girls and Boys Track teams, 15 out for Varsity Baseball, 21 for F/S Baseball, and 15 out for Softball.

# Mr. Anderson-Central Principal

Mr. Anderson gave the Board an update on the Central 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Volleyball team. The team finished the season 23-3. The season ended with a loss to Morton at Sectionals.

# Belle & Neponset Classroom Additions

Dr. Sullens stated that the Belle classrooms are expected to be open to students when we come back from Spring Break. He stated that the Neponset project is behind schedule and we are hoping to be in there in early May.

# Consideration and Approval of Naming Rights for the KHS Stadium Fieldhouse

Dr. Sullens recommended approving the naming rights for the KHS Stadium Fieldhouse. Dr. Rick Cernovich and Kim Cernovich have pledged \$250,000 towards the project. The new Fieldhouse will be known as Cernovich Field House in honor of their fathers, George and Mike.

Member DeBord seconded a motion made by Member Stabler to approve. The roll call vote showed Members DeBord, Christiansen, Salisbury, Steffen, Stabler, Dev, and Johnson all voting aye. There were no nay votes heard. The motion carried.

Consideration and Approval of Naming Rights for the KHS Ag Science Center's Classroom & FFA Lounge

Dr. Sullens recommended approving the naming rights for the KHS Ag Science Center's Classroom and FFA Lounge. The classroom and FFA Lounge will be named in honor of Rodney R. Dorman. The Rod Dorman family has pledged \$75,000 towards the project. The amount will be paid over five years. Member DeBord seconded a motion made by Member Christiansen to approve. The roll call vote showed Members Christiansen, Salisbury, Steffen, Stabler, Dev, DeBord, and Johnson all voting aye. There were no nay votes heard. The motion carried.

<u>Consideration and Approval of KHS IHSA Membership Renewal for 2023-2024 School Year</u> Dr. Sullens recommended approving the KHS IHSA Membership Renewal for the 2023-2024 School Year. Dr. Sullens informed the Board that there was no fee for the Membership.

Member Salisbury seconded a motion made by Member Steffen to approve. The roll call vote showed Members Salisbury, Steffen, Stabler, Dev, DeBord, Christiansen, and Johnson all voting aye. There were no nay votes heard. The motion carried.

#### Consideration and Approval of Lyle Addition Bid

Dr. Sullens recommended approving the bid from Valley Construction for \$307,600. Only one bid was received. This approximately 500 square foot addition will house space for Speech Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Physical Therapy. Member Dev seconded a motion made by Member Christiansen to approve. The roll call vote showed Members Steffen, Stabler, Dev, DeBord, Christiansen, Salisbury, and Johnson all voting aye. There were no nay votes heard. The motion carried.

#### Consideration and Approval of Intergovernmental Cooperative Agreement Resolution

Dr. Sullens recommended approving the Intergovernmental Cooperative Agreement Resolution with the Quad City CTE Consortium. The QCCTEC assists the District in receiving federal Perkins Grant funds.

Member Stabler seconded a motion made by Member DeBord to approve. The roll call vote showed Members Stabler, Dev, DeBord, Christiansen, Salisbury, Steffen, and Johnson all voting aye. There were no nay votes heard. The motion carried.

#### Consideration and Approval of Joint Agreement Resolution

Dr. Sullens recommended approving the Joint Agreement Resolution with the Quad City CTE Consortium. This resolution updates the previous Joint Agreement between the District and the QCCTEC.

Member DeBord seconded a motion made by Member Dev to approve. The roll call vote showed Members Dev, DeBord, Christiansen, Salisbury, Steffen, Stabler and Johnson all voting aye. There were no nay votes heard. The motion carried.

Consideration and Approval of Changing the District's Insurance Agent of Record from Dimond Brothers to Kepple Healthcare Consulting Effective April 1, 2023

Dr. Sullens recommended changing the District's Insurance Agent of Record to Kepple Healthcare Consulting effective April 1, 2023.

Member Steffen seconded a motion made by Member Salisbury to approve. The roll call vote showed Members DeBord, Christiansen, Salisbury, Steffen, Stabler, Dev, and Johnson all voting aye. There were no nay votes heard. The motion carried.

<u>Consideration and Approval of Compensation Adjustment for Technology and Assistant Technology Director</u> Dr. Sullens recommended adjusting the pay rate for the Technology Director and Assistant Technology Director. After researching the pay rates of area districts IT staff and reviewing job descriptions, Dr. Sullens stated an adjustment is necessary.

Member Christiansen seconded a motion made by Member Steffen to approve. The roll call vote showed Members Christiansen, Salisbury, Steffen, Stabler, Dev, DeBord, and Johnson all voting aye. There were no nay votes heard. The motion carried.
