

Dear Parents/Guardians/Students,

We want to help you take an item off your school supply list: a flu vaccine. Influenza, commonly known as the flu is an infection of the nose, throat, and lungs caused by influenza viruses. The flu can be very dangerous, especially for children. *Each year over 125 children die from the flu; almost half of them were previously healthy children with no prior illness.* The best way to prevent the flu is by getting a flu vaccine each year. Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) recommends everyone over the age of six months to get a flu vaccine every season.

One of the most common reasons that people do not get the flu shot is because they believe it causes illness including the flu. That is a myth; the flu vaccine <u>does not</u> cause the flu and is safe for children and adults.

OSF HealthCare Saint Luke Medical Center will be offering **FREE** flu vaccinations for all school age youth in Kewanee during the school day. In order for your child to receive a **FREE** flu vaccine, your consent is required. Please sign and return the attached consent form allowing your child to receive a flu vaccine. When the vaccination dates are scheduled, you will be notified.

Everyday steps can be taken to help prevent the spread of germs including:

- Covering coughs and sneezes with a tissue.
- Staying away from people who are sick.
- Washing hands with soap and water. If soap and water aren't available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Avoiding contact with your eyes, nose and mouth. Germs spread this way.
- If someone at home is sick, keep the sick person in a separate room from others in the home.
- Keeping surfaces like tables, counters, toys and doorknobs clean by wiping them down with a household disinfectant.

We are pleased to offer a **FREE** flu vaccine for your child this school year. If you have any questions, please contact your school nurse. Together, we can give our students the very best chance to succeed and remain healthy!
